Non-take-up of benefits at the start of the COVID-19 pandemic

The problem



Hundreds or thousands were eligible for Universal Credit during the start of the COVID-19 pandemic but did not claim it.



Many people were suffering financial strain, and some were even skipping meals.



We analysed a YouGov survey and conducted qualitative interviews to investigate why.

Findings

500,000

were eligible for Universal Credit during the start of the COVID-19 pandemic **but did not claim it.**

27%

said even though they were elgible to claim, they didn't because of benefits stigma.

1 in 6 (80,000)

had skipped a meal in the previous two weeks because they could not afford to eat – compared to one-in-forty members of the general public excluding claimants.

Recommendation: We need a national take-up strategy to increase claims
